A. **CONSIDERATION TO APPROVE A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE FINAL PLAT OF MURRAY COURT PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT, ACCEPTING A SUBDIVISION IMPROVEMENT GUARANTEE, AND EXECUTING A SUBDIVISION IMPROVEMENT AGREEMENT**

A Resolution to approve the Final Plat of the Murray Court Planned Unit Development, currently addressed as 2260 and 2270 Cumorah Way, Green River, Wyoming. The proposed development subdivides the property into 8 saleable townhouse lots and one common ownership tract for parking and private park/open space. Lots 1-4 of the development already have existing townhouse units built upon them. Lots 5-8 of the development will be available for new townhouse construction. The Resolution also accepts a Subdivision Improvement Agreement and Subdivision Improvement Guarantee in the amount of \$14,750.00 for the installation of public improvements.

Suggested Motion: I move to approve the resolution to accept the Final Plat of the Murray Court Planned Unit Development, accept a Subdivision Improvement Guarantee in the amount of \$14,750.00, and authorize the Mayor to execute a Subdivision Improvement Agreement between the City of Green River and Murray Court, LLC.

WHEREAS, Diaper Need, the condition of not having a sufficient supply of clean diapers to ensure that infants and toddlers are clean, healthy and dry, can adversely affect the health and welfare of infants, toddlers and their families; and

WHEREAS, national surveys report that one in three mothers experiencing diaper need at some time while their children are less than three years of age, and forty-eight percent of families delay changing a diaper to extend their supply; and

WHEREAS, the average infant or toddler requires an average of 50 diaper changes per week over three years; and

WHEREAS, diapers cannot be bought with food stamps or WIC vouchers, therefore obtaining a sufficient supply of diapers can cause economic hardship to families; and

WHEREAS, a supply of diapers is generally an eligibility requirement for infant and toddlers to participate in childcare programs and quality early education programs; and

WHEREAS, the people of Green River, WY recognize that addressing Diaper Need can lead to economic opportunity for the state's low-income families and can lead to improved health for families and their communities; and

WHEREAS, The City of Green River is proud to be home to various community organizations that recognize the importance of diapers in helping provide economic stability for families and distribute diapers to the poor families through various channels; now

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that I, Mayor Pete Rust, do hereby proclaim the week of **September 26th through October 2th, 2016**



Subject:

A Resolution approving the Final Plat of Planned Unit Development, accepting a Subdivision Improvement Guarantee, and authorizing the Mayor to execute a Subdivision Improvement Agreement between the City of Green River and Murray Court, LLC.

Background/Alternatives:

On May 11, 2016, the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval of the Final Plat and Final Development Plan of Murray Court Planned Unit Development. This subdivision is a re-subdivision of Lot 5W and Lot 6W of the Watson Addition, and Lot 7 and Lot 8 of the Cumorah Addition. The properties included within this development are currently addressed as 2260 and 2270 Cumorah Way. New addresses will be assigned after approval.

The proposed development subdivides the property into 8 sellable townhouse lots and also includes Tract A which is common ownership that will be maintained through a Homeowners Association. Lots 1-4 of the development already have existing townhouse units built upon them. Lots 5-8 of the development will be available for new townhouse construction.

Through the review and public hearing process, it was determined that the proposed development complies with all of the requirements of the Planned Unit Development and Subdivision Regulations of the City of Green River as submitted.

The subdividers, Phillip and Kathleen Hodges of Murray Court, LLC, have submitted a Standby Letter of Credit in the amount of \$14,750.00 to guarantee the installation of the necessary public facilities associated with the development. In addition, a Subdivision Improvement Agreement has been submitted that outlines the City's procedures for releasing the letter of credit and specifies the procedures for the issuance of building permits, acceptance of subdivision improvements (including the required one year warranty), and the issuance of certificates of occupancy.






A RESOLUTION APPROVING AND ACCEPTING THE FINAL PLAT OF MURRAY COURT PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT, ACCEPTING A SUBDIVISION IMPROVEMENT GUARANTEE, AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE A SUBDIVISION IMPROVEMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF GREEN RIVER AND MURRAY COURT, LLC.

WHEREAS, after holding a public hearing and proper review before the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Green River, Wyoming, on May 11, 2016, it was resolved that the Final Plat and Final Development of the Murray Court Planned Unit Development, a Re-Subdivision of Lot 5W and 6W of the Watson Addition, and Lot 7 and Lot 8 of the Cumorah Addition, complies with all requirements of Appendix C of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Green River; and,

WHEREAS, said Commission recommends to the Governing Body of the City of Green River that the final plat of the Murray Court Planned Unit Development be approved and accepted by the Governing Body of the City of Green River; and,

WHEREAS, Murray Court, LLC has provided the City of Green River with a Subdivision Improvement Guarantee, in the form of a Standby Letter of Credit, issued by State Bank, in the amount of Fourteen Thousand, Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars and Zero Cents, (\$14,750.00); and,

WHEREAS, Murray Court, LLC has provided a Subdivision Improvement Agreement to guarantee the installation of the necessary public facilities required within the Subdivision Regulations of the City of Green River, and as shown on the Construction Drawings and Cost Estimate as approved by the City Engineer on May 20, 2016; and,

WHEREAS, after due and proper review held on September 20, 2016 the Governing Body of the City of Green River has accepted and approved said resolution of the Green River Planning and Zoning Commission and has elected to approve and accept said final plat of the Murray Court Planned Unit Development, a Re-Subdivision of Lot 5W and 6W of the Watson Addition, and Lot 7 and Lot 8 of the Cumorah Addition, as a subdivision in the City of Green River, Sweetwater County, Wyoming;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF GREEN RIVER, STATE OF WYOMING:

Section 1. That the final plat of the Murray Court Planned Unit Development be, and the same is hereby approved and accepted as a Final Plat.

Section 2. That the following described parcel of ground comprising the Murray Court Planned Unit Development, and the same is hereby accepted as a subdivision in the City of Green River, said subdivision to be known as Murray Court Planned Unit Development:

That the foregoing plat designated as Murray Court Planned Unit Development, is located in the SE/4 of the SW/4 of Section 26, Township 18 North, Range 107 West, of the 6th Principal Meridian, all of Lot 7 and Lot 8 of the Cumorah Addition as recorded on Plat Number 250, and Lot 5W and Lot 6W of the Watson Addition as recorded on Plat Number 348, City of Green River, Sweetwater County, Wyoming, being more particularly described as follows;

SUBDIVISION IMPROVEMENT AGREEMENT

AN AGREEMENT RELATING TO THE COMPLETION OF IMPROVEMENTS WITHIN THE MURRAY COURT PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT, A RE-SUBDIVISION OF LOT 5W AND 6W OF THE WATSON ADDITION, AND LOT 7 AND LOT 8 OF THE CUMORAH ADDITION, CITY OF GREEN RIVER, SWEETWATER COUNTY, WYOMING.

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into this 20th day of September, 2016, by and between the CITY OF GREEN RIVER, WYOMING, (hereinafter called CITY), and MURRAY COURT, LLC, (hereinafter /called SUBDIVIDER).

WITNESSETH:

- A) That the SUBDIVIDER submitted to the CITY for approval the Final Plat of the Murray Court Planned Unit Development, (hereinafter called SUBDIVISION); and,
- B) That certain subdivision improvements are required by the City of Green River Subdivision Regulations, (hereinafter called REGULATIONS), to be installed by the SUBDIVIDER; and,
- C) That the SUBDIVIDER is required by the REGULATIONS to guarantee the installation of all required subdivision improvements, according to plans and specifications submitted and approved by the City Engineer, prior to approval and recording of the subdivision plat; and,
- D) That the amount of the guarantee is based on an estimate provided by the SUBDIVIDER’S engineer and approved by the City Engineer and is an amount not less than one hundred percent (100%) of the estimated cost of all required subdivision improvements remaining to be installed and approved; and,
- E) That the SUBDIVIDER has furnished to the CITY a Subdivision Improvement Guarantee, in the form of a Standby Letter of Credit, issued by State Bank, in the amount of Fourteen Thousand, Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars and Zero Cents (\$14,750.00), as stated in the approved Engineer’s Cost Estimate; and,
- F) That in accordance with the City of Green River Code of Ordinance, Appendix C, Section 9.b., the Subdivider shall have all required improvements installed within twenty-four (24) months from the date of the guarantee or a commitment accepted by the City.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties hereto do mutually agree as follows:

- 1) The SUBDIVIDER shall provide the CITY with a signed Mylar of the subdivision plat along with a check payable to Sweetwater County in the amount of \$75 for the recordation of the plat. The CITY shall secure the necessary CITY signatures and submit the plat for recording with the Sweetwater County Clerk.

- 2) Upon recording the Final Plat with the Sweetwater County Clerk, lots within the subdivision may be sold.
- 3) All subdivision improvements designated on Addendum "A" to this AGREEMENT, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, and being a list of the required subdivision improvements and Engineer's Estimate of construction costs, as approved by the City Engineer, shall be constructed and completed by the SUBDIVIDER, according to plans and specifications prepared by William H. Smith and Associates, Inc., and approved by the City Engineer on May 20, 2016.
- 4) The submitted Subdivision Improvement Guarantee, in the form of a Standby Letter of Credit, issued by State Bank, in the amount of Fourteen Thousand, Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars and Zero Cents (\$14,750.00), is to guarantee the completion of all SUBDIVISION improvements described in Addendum "A".
- 5) All subdivision improvements designated on Addendum "A" shall be installed, constructed and completed by the SUBDIVIDER by September 20, 2018. All construction shall be performed in a good and workmanlike manner, in accordance with applicable rules and regulations governing such construction.
- 6) At any time after the satisfactory completion of construction of all or any SUBDIVISION improvements or categories thereof, the SUBDIVIDER shall give written notice to the City Engineer of such completion. The SUBDIVIDER'S Engineer of Record shall provide the City Engineer with As-Built Drawings, required pressure test and disinfection test records, and any other required documentation necessary for the City Engineer's inspection of the completed improvements. The SUBDIVIDER shall cooperate in the reasonable inspection of the improvements by the City Engineer.
- 7) After receipt of the above notice of completion and required documentation from the Engineer of Record, the City Engineer shall inspect the SUBDIVISION improvements to which the notice of completion applies, and shall give the SUBDIVIDER either written notice of approval or denial and corrective action required. Upon completion of any required corrective action, notice, inspection and approval or denial shall be required in like manner as cited above.
- 8) Upon receipt of a notice of approval by the City Engineer, the SUBDIVIDER may request the release of the proportionate amount of the subdivision improvement guarantee that corresponds with the notice of approval by the City Engineer. The request for reduction shall be made in writing by the SUBDIVIDER to the CITY. The written request shall include an itemized list of the public improvements that were completed, inspected and approved by the City Engineer, and shall include the requested amount to be released. After receiving receipt of the City Engineer's acceptance to release a portion of the subdivision improvement guarantee, the CITY's Community Development Department shall schedule the release for approval by the Green River City Council at the next available regular meeting of the City Council. In no event shall the security be reduced to less than twenty-five (25%) of its original amount unless and until final acceptance of all subdivision improvements as outlined in Paragraph 11 below, is completed.

Approval of the release does not grant CITY ownership and maintenance of the improvements. CITY acceptance of ownership and maintenance of the improvements will not occur until final acceptance of all subdivision improvements as outlined in Paragraph 11 below.

- 9) Building Permits may only be issued by the City Building Inspector after all monumentation and staking has been completed, and upon approval by the City Engineer of the public improvements consisting of water lines and stubs to each lot, sanitary sewer lines and stubs to each lot. The SUBDIVIDER'S Engineer of Record shall also provide curb elevations for all lots prior to the issuance of any building permit.
- 10) Upon completion of all SUBDIVISION improvements described in Addendum "A", approval of the SUBDIVISION improvements by the City Engineer, and prior to the CITY accepting ownership and maintenance of the Subdivision improvements, the SUBDIVIDER shall provide the CITY with a written warranty, in the form of a maintenance bond, or other security approved by the CITY, for a period of twelve (12) months from the date of acceptance of the improvements by the City Council. The amount of the security for the warranty period shall be twenty-five (25%) percent of the total amount listed in Addendum "A".
- 11) Upon submittal of the warranty, and receipt of the written notice by the City Engineer of the approval of all SUBDIVISION improvements, the Community Development Department shall schedule action by the Green River City Council at the next available regular meeting of the City Council to accept the one year maintenance bond, acceptance of the ownership and maintenance of the public subdivision improvements, and to release of any unreleased portion of the Subdivision Improvement Guarantee referenced to in herein.
- 12) Certificates of Occupancy shall not be issued until the City Council has issued final acceptance of the subdivision improvements as outlined in Paragraph 11 of this AGREEMENT.





Building Inspector

DEFINITION

Under direction, perform inspection work enforcing compliance with building codes and ordinances; check plans, compute building permit fees, and issue permits; conduct zoning, housing, and code enforcement; and provide information as requested.

SUPERVISION RECEIVED

Reports to the Senior Building Inspector or the Director of Community Development.

SUPERVISION EXERCISED

May exercise technical and functional supervision over lower level staff.

EXAMPLES OF IMPORTANT AND ESSENTIAL DUTIES

Perform inspections of various phases of residential building construction for compliance with the various building codes; review plans and issue permits.

Field check electrical, plumbing, and mechanical plans, layouts and site plans of residential buildings for proper installation and use of materials to ensure compliance with appropriate codes.

Inspect and approve work at each of the required stages of completion and order corrective action if necessary; make final inspections for compliance to pertinent laws, regulations, and codes; prepare reports of inspections and work completed; investigate code violations; prepare reports of findings.

Advise and interpret codes to lay persons, contractors, architects, and others as required; coordinate construction progress with other City departments or divisions and outside agencies.

Conduct studies and investigations of such problems as converting the use of a building, condemning a building, or assessing damage to buildings caused by fire or vehicles.

Inspect and approve construction of signs and sign locations, directional signals, and related structures.

Receive, record, and investigate complaints from the public and staff regarding violations of municipal codes, ordinances, standards, and health and safety regulations; document violations by securing photographs and other pertinent data; research ownership records, prior complaints, municipal codes and ordinances, and state regulations to establish whether a violation has occurred.

Inspect existing buildings, structures, and properties to determine their conformity with City, state, and federal standards and laws pertaining to zoning, housing, building, and other related codes to prevent blight in the City; conduct re-inspections to ensure compliance.

Abate public nuisances such as vacant structures, abandoned vehicles, signs, and property maintenance.

Maintain current field activity inspection logs; issue correction notices; prepare detailed police reports, inspection warrants, abatement warrants, and staff reports; submit statistical data for monthly reports and other correspondence.

Confer and coordinate enforcement activities with members of other departments and agencies.

Initiate contacts with residents, business representatives, and other parties to explain the nature of incurred violations and to encourage compliance with municipal codes, ordinances, and community standards.

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

Alcohol Inspection Contract

1. **Parties:** The parties to this Contract are Wyoming Association of Sheriffs and Chiefs of Police (Association), whose address is P.O. Box 481, Douglas WY 82633 and Green River Police Department, whose address is 50 East 2nd North, Green River, WY 82935.
2. **Purpose:** To provide Alcohol inspections in communities in the state of Wyoming.
3. **Term:** This Contract is effective when all parties have executed it and all required signatures have been granted. The term of the Contract is from July 1, 2016, through May 28, 2017. All services shall be completed during this term.
4. **Payment:**
 - A. The total amount of this contract shall not exceed (\$3,400.00).
 - B. Payment for administrative fees and for conducting compliance inspections of Alcohol retailers shall be made based upon submission to the Association of compliance forms and a monthly invoice.
 - C. All invoicing for Alcohol compliance inspections shall be paid upon receipt by the Association of compliance inspection reports and invoices. No payment shall be made by the Association in the absence of the timely submission of a proper invoice.
 - D. Payment shall be based on a rate of eighty-five dollars (\$85.00) per inspection.
 - 1) From the eighty-five dollars (\$85.00) the Department may:
 - a. Pay the officer conducting the compliance visit double time;
 - b. Purchase a ten dollar (\$10.00) gift certificate which the officer will present to the retail clerk if the clerk has complied with the law and has refused to sell Alcohol to a minor under twenty-one (21) years of age.
 - c. Pay the assisting minor/youth ten dollars (\$10.00) per compliance inspection.
5. **Responsibilities of the Department:**
 - A. Conduct and complete Alcohol compliance inspections as follows:
 - 1) Complete two (2) Alcohol compliance inspections per year for every establishment that sells Alcohol products in the community, including bars.
 - 2) **The first Alcohol compliance inspections must take place between July 1, 2016 and December 31, 2016. The second Alcohol compliance inspections must take place between January 1, 2017, and May 28, 2017.**

- 3) The above compliance schedule may be modified with the Association's prior written approval.
 - B. Complete a yearly report for Alcohol compliance inspections.

This provision shall become effective only if the party failing to perform immediately notifies the other party of the extent and nature of the problem, limits delay in performance to that required by the event, and takes all reasonable steps to minimize delays. This provision shall not be effective unless the failure to perform is beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the nonperforming party.
- K. **Independent Contractor:** The Department shall function as an independent contractor for the purposes of this Contract and shall not be considered an employee of the Association for any purpose. The Department shall assume sole

responsibility for any debts or liabilities that may be incurred by the Department in fulfilling the terms of this Contract, and shall be solely responsible for the payment of all federal, state and local taxes which may accrue because of this Contract. Nothing in this Contract shall be interpreted as authorizing the Department or its agents and/or employees to act as an agent or representative for or on behalf of the Association, or to incur any obligation of any kind on the behalf of the Association. The Department agrees that no health/hospitalization benefits, workers' compensation and/or similar benefits available to Association employees will inure to the benefit of the Department or the Department's agents and/or employees as a result of this Contract.

L. **Kickbacks:** The Department certifies and warrants that no gratuities, kickbacks, or contingency fees were paid in connection with this Contract, nor were any fees, commissions, gifts, or other considerations made contingent upon the award of this Contract. If the Department breaches or violates this warranty, the Association may, at its discretion, terminate this Contract without liability to the Association, or deduct from the contract price or consideration, or otherwise recover, the full amount of any commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingency fee.

1) The Department shall comply with the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act (18 USC 874) as supplemented in the Department of Labor Regulations (29 CFR, Part 3). This Act provides that the Department is prohibited from inducing by any means, any person employed in the construction, completion, or repair of public work, to give up any part of the compensation to which he is otherwise entitled.

2) No staff member of the Department shall engage in any contract activity which would constitute a conflict of interest as related to this Contract.

M. **Nondiscrimination:** The Department shall comply with Presidential Executive Order 11246 entitled, "Equal Employment Opportunity," as amended by Presidential Executive Order 11375, and as supplemented in the Department of Labor Regulations (41 CFR Part 60), the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Wyoming Fair Employment Practices Act (Wyo. Stat. § 27-9-105 et seq.), the Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA), 42 U.S.C. §12101, et seq, and the Age Discrimination Act of 1975. The Department shall assure that no person is discriminated against based on the grounds of sex, race, age, religion, national origin, or disability in connection with the performance of this Contract.

N. **Notices:** All notices arising out of, or from, the provisions of this Contract shall be in writing and given to the parties at the address provided under this Contract, either by regular mail or delivery in person.

O. **Ownership of Documents:** All reports, data, studies, work product, and other material prepared by the Department pursuant to performance under the terms and conditions of this Contract shall become the property of the Association. The Association shall have unrestricted authority to publish, disclose, distribute, and otherwise use in whole or in part any reports, data, or other materials prepared by the Department under this Contract. Until the Association publishes, discloses,

distributes, uses, or makes any of the information developed or compiled by the Department public, Department agrees that the information is confidential and, therefore, will not disclose it.

- P. **Severability:** Should any portion of this Contract be judicially determined to be illegal or unenforceable, the remainder of the Contract shall continue in full force and effect, and either party may renegotiate the terms affected by the severance.
- Q. **Taxes:** The Department shall pay all taxes and other such amounts required by federal, state, and local law, including but not limited to federal and social security taxes, workers' compensation, unemployment insurance, and sales taxes.
- R. **Termination of Contract:** This Contract may be terminated, without cause, by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice. This Contract may be terminated immediately for cause if the Department fails to perform in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Contract. Should the Department fail to perform in a manner consistent with the terms and conditions set forth in this Contract, payment under this Contract may be withheld until such time as the Department performs its duties and responsibilities.
- S. **Third Party Beneficiary Rights:** The parties do not intend to create in any other individual or entity the status of third party beneficiary, and this Contract shall not be construed so as to create such status. The rights, duties and obligations contained in this Contract shall operate only between the parties to this Contract, and shall inure solely to the benefit of the parties to this Contract. The provisions of this Contract are intended only to assist the parties in determining and performing their obligations under this Contract. The parties to this Contract intend and expressly agree that only parties signatory to this Contract shall have any legal or equitable right to seek to enforce this Contract, to seek any remedy arising out of a party's performance or failure to perform any term or condition of this Contract, or to bring an action for the breach of this Contract.
- T. **Time:** Time is of the essence in all provisions of the Contract.
- U. **Titles Not Controlling:** Titles of paragraphs are for reference only, and shall not be used to construe the language in this Contract.
- V. **Waiver:** The waiver of any breach of any term or condition in this Contract shall not be deemed a waiver of any prior or subsequent breach.
- W. **Suspension and Debarment.** By signing this Grant Agreement, Grantee certifies that neither it nor its principals are presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction nor from federal financial or non-financial assistance, nor are any of the participants involved in the execution of this Grant Agreement suspended, debarred, or voluntarily excluded by any federal department or agency in accordance with Executive Order 12549 (Debarment and Suspension) and CFR 44 Part 17, or are on the disbarred vendors list at www.epls.gov. Further, Grantee agrees to notify Council by certified mail should it or any of its agents become

debarred, suspended, or voluntarily excluded during the term of this Grant Agreement.

8. **Signatures:** In witness thereof, the parties to this Contract, either personally or through their duly authorized representatives, have executed this Contract on the days and dates set out below, and certify that they have read, understood, and agreed to the terms and conditions of this Contract.







We would like to include the installation of two (2) banner poles on Flaming Gorge Way demarcating the borders of our downtown's Main Street District. 




