Why Disc Golf ?

There are now more than 8,000 Disc Golf courses in the United States, nearly all installed by city and county parks departments.

Disc Golf has relatively low capital and maintenance costs.

This can be enjoyed by all from beginners of all ages.



What is Disc Golf ?

- Disc Golf is played much like traditional golf. Instead of hitting a ball into a hole, you throw a more streamlined looking Frisbee disc into a supported metal basket. The goal is the same: to complete the course in the fewest number of shots. A golf disc is thrown from a tee area to each basket, which is the “hole”. As players progress down the fairway, they must make each consecutive shot from the spot where the previous throw has landed. The trees, shrubs, and terrain changes in around the fairways provide challenging obstacles for the golfer. Finally, the “putt” lands in the basket and the hole is completed.

- Nature area

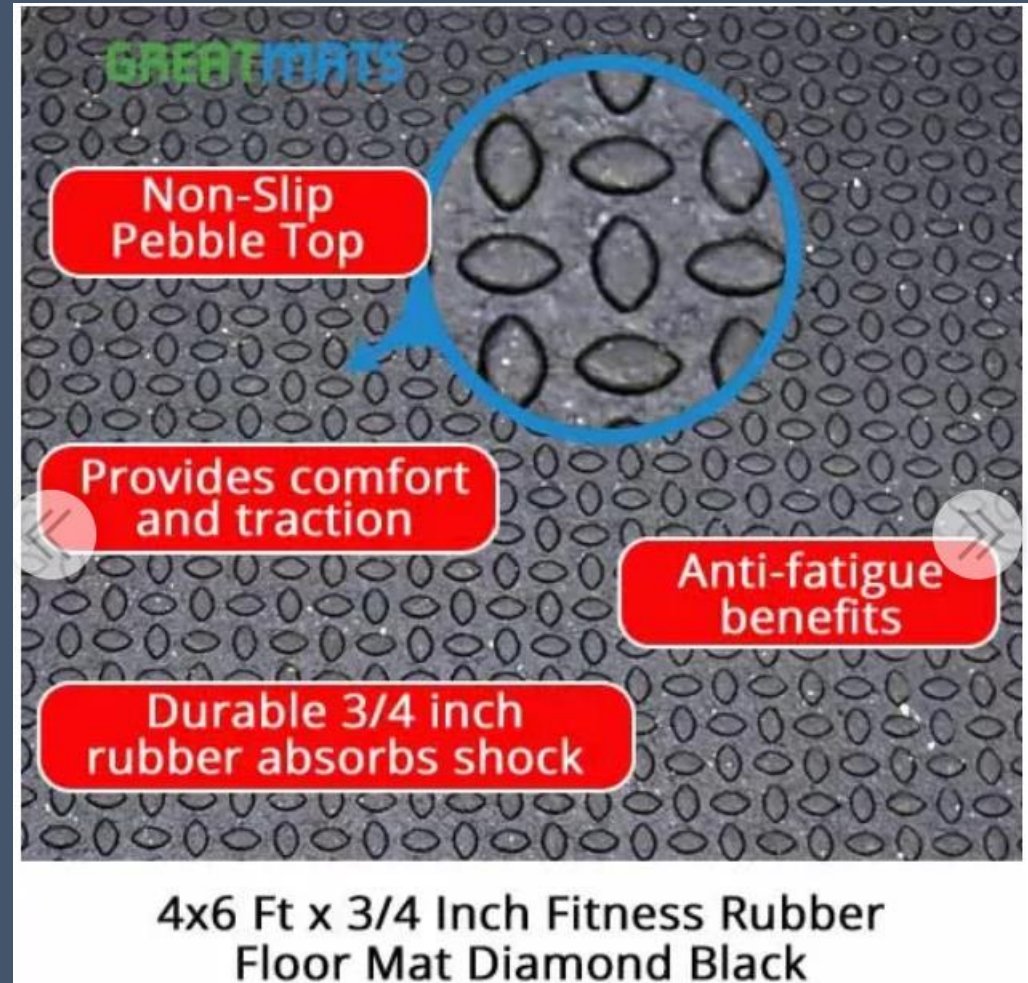
Installation of a 18-Hole Disc Golf Course

- Trim and/or removal of brush



Tee Box Installation

- Each hole would have one (1) rubber floor mat 4 x 8
 - Example shown is a 4 x 6
- 25 year lifespan
- Limited warranty

 - Debris
 - Tree limbs and Brush
 - Pathway
 - Trash-free zones

Flaming Gorge Way Corridor Study – Context



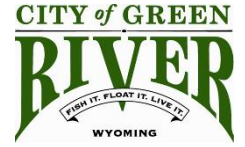
History

- Last rebuilt by WYDOT in early 1980's
 - Water system still owned by PP&L (JPWB in 1988)
 - Prior to ADA (1990)
- Concrete has 40-50 year useful life

Concerns

- ADA / Walkability
- Surface / Ride Quality
- Water Mains / Fire Flow
- Storm Drain System
- Inconsistent Land Uses
- Traffic / LOS not a concern
 - Except when Tunnels are Closed

Flaming Gorge Way Corridor Study – Process



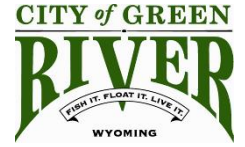
WYDOT Planning Grant
