The Green River Park System has come a long way since it was established in the 1970's. Our forefather's vision was to incorporate a vital community with adequate public parks and open spaces to provide every Green River citizen with the opportunity to enjoy nature without traveling far from home.

Today our park system is composed of 28 parks, including a number of public open spaces that total over 765 acres of developed and undeveloped park land. Our City limits encompass approximately 15 square miles. A system of greenways or recreation corridors consisting of small parcels of open space land, were planned to ultimately connect many of the City's major parks and provide bicycling, horseback riding and walking opportunities to citizens. Green River Parks and Recreation Department acts as stewards for this land, as well as for our riparian and urban forest system, by maintaining the landscape of over 765 acres of property.

The City of Green River Parks and Recreation Department offers recreational opportunities to its citizens that range from both organized active recreational opportunities and individual activities.

For example: a 54,000 square foot Recreation Center, a 5,000 square foot Historical Indoor Pavilion rental facility (which is used for weddings, dances, family reunions and banquets) and nine softball/baseball/athletic fields. Numerous other leisure pursuits and offerings include: hiking, biking, greenbelt pathways and open space trails are available to citizenry.

Parks and natural areas designated as Nature and Open Space (passive and leisure recreational opportunities) make up nearly 80% of the total park acreage and offers citizens an opportunity to experience wildlife and plants in a natural setting.

All facets of recreation, whether passive or active, can be found in this guide. Staff takes pride in working to provide Green River with a nationally Accredited Parks and Recreation Department with a system of parks, recreation and leisure opportunities that add enrichment to the lives of all its citizens.

## Facilities

(All maintained the by Parks Division- landscape maintenance; seeding, weed removal, snow removal, etc. mowing)

1. Area 51 Skate Park – 13,500 square feet, lighted, fenced, concrete/asphalt pad, American Ramp Company (ARC) designed, located within Collier Park.
2. City Hall Grounds - 0.2 acres
3. Clock Tower Mall (park area); located just south of city hall in the main street corridor.
4. Fire Station # 2

5. FMC Red Barn – 8,410 square feet indoor, heated facility.
6. Green River Recreation Center – approximately 80,000 square feet of total space; 160 total parking spaces (9' X 18'), 54,000 square foot facility, lobby area (seating for 28), ping-pong, billiard table, swimming pool, men's and women's locker rooms, sauna, hot tub, steam room, gymnasium, four racquetball courts, cardio equipment (i.e. treadmills, elliptical machines, stationary bicycles and stair steppers), weight room, nursery, multi-purpose room (for rentals), fitness room, outdoor baseball/softball batting cages and a half mile outdoor Barbara Carroll Memorial walking/jogging pathway.
7. Municipal Horse Corrals – 18 acres; 144 corrals measuring 40' X 40' (1,600 square feet/each corral), 22' X 60' manure pit for lessees, 2-55' diameter exercise pens, 1-42' dimension mechanical exercise pen (horse corral walker for exercise).
8. Outdoor Archery Shooting Range (at FMC Park) – 300' X 350', fenced, 16 shooting bays.
9. Outdoor Gun Shooting Range – 10 total shooting bays (7 covered and 3 uncovered), various shooting target distances/placements.
10. Parks Maintenance Shop – 1.85 acres; 8,960 square foot light industrial building with 864 square foot detached storage garage.
11. Pavilion – 5,000 square foot wooden floor space, commercial kitchen for catering and rentals, wet bar, 440 square foot meeting room.
12. Rodeo Arena - 1 acre; lighted, one covered grandstand with a seating capacity of 1,500, 11 horse pens, announcer's booth (enclosed), 2-individual bleachers (300 person seating capacity), 1-individual bleacher (100 person seating capacity), 4-individual bleachers (50 person each bleacher seating capacity), public address/sound system, and one 8' X 8' enclosed wooden ticket booth.
13. Stratton Myers Park Amphitheater – stage dimensions are 65' X 52' = 3,380 square feet


