

Expedition Island Pavilion



Green River, Wyoming, home of the Expedition Island Pavilion. The Pavilion is located on the island made famous with the launching of John Wesley Powell's 1869 River Expedition down the Green and Colorado River and arriving at the mouth of the Grand Canyon and again with his 1871 expedition in which the route was mapped.

On April 16, 1969 that the Expedition Island Pavilion was designated as a Registered Historic Landmark by the U.S. Department of the Interiors National Park Service. This designation indicates that the site possesses exceptional value in commemorating a part of history to the United States.

This historic 5,000 square foot building, complete with a commercial kitchen, wet bar, coat check and additional 440 square foot meeting/dressing room is the ideal venue that has hosted meetings, weddings and many other celebrations.
